## Rethinking the Calorie

I often read food labels. Do you ever wonder where this idea of the calorie comes from and where do they get these numbers? I am calling on Jeff Foxworthy to reduce caloric intake into numbers I can understand.

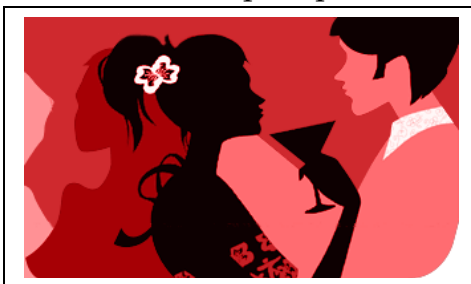

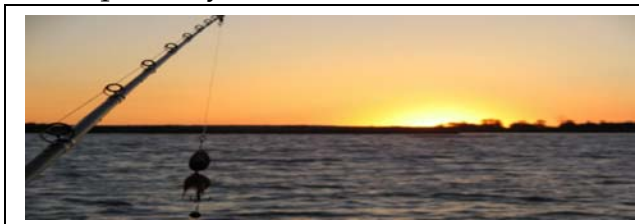


## Management VP

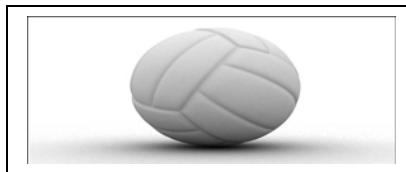

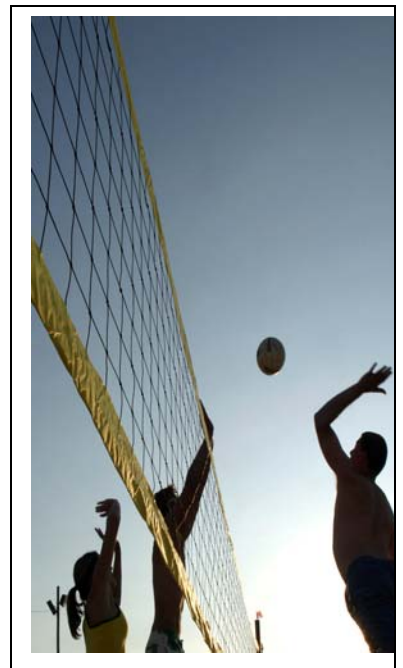

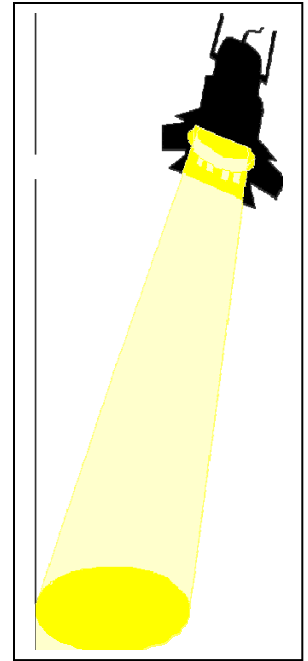
