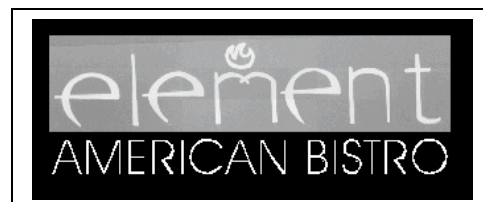

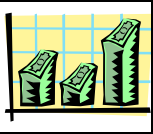

*He attended Harvard University and graduated with a B.A. in government in June 1969.

*He was shipped to Vietnam, arriving on January 2, 1971. He served with the 20th Engineer Brigade in Bien Hoa.

* He decided to quit law school and run for the United States House of Representatives.

* He was re-elected to the House three times, in 1978, 1980, and 1982

*He ran for President in the 1988 United States presidential election, but lost to Michael Dukakis

*Bill Clinton chose Gore to be his running mate for the 1992 United States presidential election

*He was Vice President of the United States from 1999-2001

*He was awarded the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize for the efforts to build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change

* He also starred in the Academy Award - winning documentary on the topic of global warming, *An Inconvenient Truth*
