- *He spent most of his career with the St. Louis Browns and the St. Louis Cardinals
- *He also played for the for the Chicago Cubs, the Boston Braves, and the New York Giants
- *In addition to not drinking or smoking, he refused to watch movies or read, in an effort to retain his batting eye.
- *He died on January 5th, 1963 of a heart attack after cataract surgery

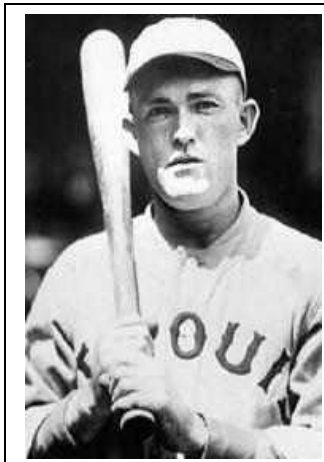

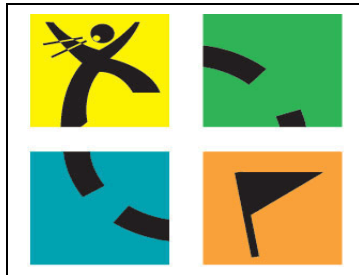
Hello Everyone-
